

# FIRST AID AT WORK REQUALIFICATION



The Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981 require all employers to ensure that first aid provision is 'adequate and appropriate to the circumstances', and that first aid personnel receive formal requalification training every 3-years. Under guidelines issued by the HSE all delegates booking onto this Requalification course will be required to provide evidence that their qualification has not expired beyond 28 days of the expiry date shown on their First Aid at Work certificate.

Approved HABC Centre This interactive and practical based 2-day Highfield certificated course will include a revision of topics covered in the 3-day first aid at work course, together with any new first aid procedures which may have been introduced since delegates last attended a first aid at work course.

This course will involve the demonstration and learning of practical first aid skills; all delegates will be expected to demonstrate competence in those skills during the taught sessions and, during the observation on Day 2. During this course delegates will be expected to work on the floor, therefore delegates are advised to wear appropriate and comfortable clothing and flat-heeled shoes; we recommend that female delegates wear trousers as opposed to skirts.

On successful completion of the 2-day FAW Requalification course, delegates will be awarded a certificate and a wallet sized card both of which are valid for 3 years from the date of the examination. It is recommended that delegates attend an annual refresher course each year to ensure they remain aware of current practices in relation to CPR, etc.

#### COURSE ASSESSMENT

Delegates will complete a 12 question multi-choice examination, followed by 3 practical assessments, including Incident Management, Dealing with Shock, Dealing with an Unconscious Casualty and CPR
